City of Wabasso Regular Meeting Monday, August 9, 2021 Agenda Report

- 1. 8/4/21 EDA Minutes Attached
- 2. EDA Loan and Checking balances attached.
- 3. City Planning Committee Attached is a summary of the Visioning/Planning session held on July 27, 2021. It has been requested that the City Council, EDA and Planning Committee meet to receive an update and discuss the report. The EDA has tentatively set the date for Wednesday, August 18, 2021, in the evening.
- 4. CEEC Building Requirements. The EDA requested staff research the building requirements for the purchase of the Main St. lot by CEEC in 2018. A review of the minutes indicates the Council specifically stated that no building requirements were attached to the purchase. This item is for informational purposes and no action is required.
- 5. Clerk/Treasurer's Report
 - a. Community Center Update The committee met with an architect to discuss upgrades to the Community Center and was informed that due to building codes it appeared that \$200,000 would only get cosmetic improvements and it would take approximately \$500,000 to do any significant improvements. Any changes to the building envelope or structure would require the entire building be brought up to code including new bathrooms. The architect sent a proposal for a facilities study for \$3,250. (See attached) Brad, Jeff and I agreed that it didn't make sense to spend the \$3,250 until it was determined budget and where the dollars would come from. At this time the committee has been looking at improvements that would not trigger building code requirements, such as new flooring, tables/chairs etc. I plan to include the Community Center discussion in the 2022 Operating Budget and Capital Improvement Plan.
 - b. Information Only I discussed the status of the Wabasso Rabbit with Curt Wieneke and he indicated that he planned to fly down to the manufacturing company in Texas on 8/16-17 and planned to return with the original statue at a minimum. He hopes to also have the two replications for the city.
- 15. Seal Coating See attached quote. It appears that COVID Relief Aid funds cannot be used for seal coating based on my review of the published rules. (See below). While the rules are still being clarified, it does not appear that seal coating or any street improvement projects will be allowed unless they are part of a sewer or water project. It is important the streets be seal coated and will be addressed in the 2022 Operating budget.
- 16. Community Center Parking Lot The city has bus, truck and motorcycle restrictions place on the Community Center parking lot. This goes back to when the parking lot only had 1 ½" of blacktop. The blacktop is now 3" thick and can support the weight of buses and trucks. Motorcycles were restricted due to kickstand damage. Jim indicated he could address the kickstand issue. It is recommended the Council remove these restrictions.
- 17. Ordinance -Water Restrictions Attached is an ordinance relating the city council enacting water restrictions. The city has been notified that the DNR has declared a Drought Warning Phase for cities located within the Minnesota River watershed. Cities need to take action to reach a goal of 50% water usage over January 2021. The council already has taken action to restrict watering between 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. It appears that compliance has been good. Paul indicated that with the restriction July usage was over the 50% goal. I would recommend that we go to an odd/even system or restrict watering to certain days of the week.
- 18. Park Maintenance agreements This item has been placed on the back burner due to other priorities. I hope to address with the new school superintendent. The softball association and

baseball information have provided the information I requested. I just haven't had the time to

19. Basketball/Tennis Court/Parking Lot update. Roger, Jim and I will give you an update at the meeting. I did get a budget estimate for repairing the tennis courts from our engineer - \$200,000

20. Welcome Farmland Coop - C Store - It would be a nice gesture for the City Council to officially welcome Farmland Coop to the community.

21. COVID Relief Aid - Attached is an excerpt from the latest rules for COVID Aid. Unfortunately, it does not appear that the funds can be used for seal coating, which puts us back to square one. I have applied for the funds, and the city has through 2024 to spend the funds. The first half should arrive in 2021 and the second half in 2022. I have again placed this on the agenda for discussion. The US Treasury recently released a facts sheet "summarizing" eligible expenses, which is 42 pages long. I will try to summarize it down to a page or two and distribute prior to

22. Brad Pitzl – Utility bill – Mr. Pitzl recently purchased 880 Pine Street. Apparently, the property has been vacant for several months, but the owner did not discontinue service. (See attached meter usage) The owner on occasion did pay the bill, but still managed to run up a significant delinquent bill (\$647.13). While owners were notified of delinquency during the COVID-19 policy period, penalties and shutoffs were not imposed which may have contributed to the delinquency. I was not aware the house was vacant. Mr. Pitzl would like to address this issue

23. Brad Pitzl has requested the Council abandon the sidewalk in front of 880 Pine Street as it is in need of replacement, and he feels it does not go anywhere. As a matter of practice, I normally oppose abandoning any sidewalks, since once abandoned it is extremely difficult to restore. In this instance however the sidewalk does end at his property and does not cross the property to the north of his. In addition, there is a very large tree which would probably need to be removed if the sidewalk was replaced.

Wabasso EDA Regular Meeting Wednesday, August 4, 2021 5:00 pm

The meeting was called to order at 5pm with Board Member Pat Eichten, Jeff Olson, Chuck Robasse and Steve Burns in attendance. Member Karl Guetter was absent. Also present were EDA Director Larry Thompson, Attorney Matt Novak, Pat Dingels, Anne and Nick Guetter.

The minutes of the July 7, 2021 Regular meeting were approved on a motion by Olson, second by Burns. Eichten – Yes; Olson – Yes; Robasse - yes; Burns – yes.

Duplex - The HRA discussed the duplex construction. Mr. Thompson reported that the bidding/construction could run concurrent with the bonding process. The bonding process could commence once the EDA/Council ordered the project, and 85% of the bond funds would need to be spent withing 3 years of issuance. Matt Novak updated the board on the bidding process noting the board could bid components separately and act as general contractor or could bid the entire project. The board would like to ensure local contractors had the opportunity to bid. Jeff Olson reported that RBC would prepare construction plans for \$1,500 - \$2,000. The board addressed Nick and Anne Guetter's concerns, noting that material prices were uncertain at this time and it was hoped they would stabilized in the near future. It was noted that the project may be bid this fall but construction would most likely begin in spring. It was also the consensus that the board did not want to act as a general contractor. Motion by Burns, second by Robasse to authorized RBC/Mark Timmerman to prepare construction drawings at a cost not to exceed \$2,000.00.

Eastvail Signs - Mr. Thompson noted that he was in the process of replacing the Eastvail Lot Sale signs. It was the consensus that Mr. Thompson continue with replacing the signs.

Strategic Plan. The board received an update on the Visioning/Planning session held on7/27/21. Mr. Thompson would forward a copy of the summary report to the board. It was the consensus that the EDA board meet with the City Council and Planning Committee the evening of August 18, 2021.

CEEC Building Requirements - The board directed staff to research the building requirements for the CEEC purchase of the Main Street lot and report its findings to the Council.

Five-Plex Ceiling Fans – It was the consensus that renters not be allowed to install ceiling fans on their own.

Five-Plex Patio/Fence Improvements – The board considered a bid by Altermatt Construction, Inc. to replace the concrete patios and privacy fences for \$16,438.88, which did not include additional fill on the south side. Motion by Olson, second by Burns to approve the bid of Altermatt Construction for \$16,438.88.

The board requested city staff consider adding fill to the south side of the units

Treasurer's report – It was noted DEEM had made its RLF payments for July and August. Motion by Olson, second by Burns to accept the Treasurer's report.

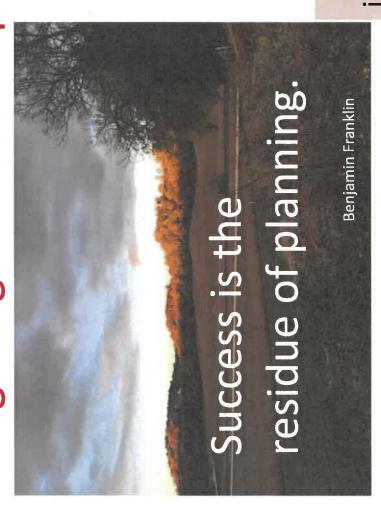

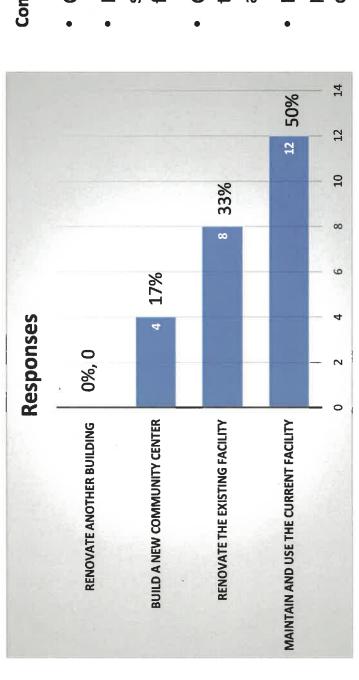

AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 209: AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE WABASSO WATER UTILITY

The City Council of the City of Wabasso ordains that Ordinance No. 209 shall be amended to include Section 20, to read as follows:

SECTION 20: WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES

- A. Whenever the City shall determine that a shortage of water exists, it may entirely prohibit water use or limit the times and hours during which water may be used from the City's Water Supply System for lawn and garden sprinkling, irrigation, car washing, air conditions, swimming pools, and other uses. It is unlawful for any water consumer to cause or permit water to be used in violation of such determination after public announcement thereof has been made or published indicated the restrictions thereof.
- B. To conserve water resources, prevent he wasteful and harmful effects of lawn sprinkling and irrigation during mid-day hours, and allow the City's water system adequate opportunity to replenish the water supply in the storage tanks, certain limitations must be placed on the use of the City's water supply. During the period of Memorial Day to Labor Day of any ear, a person may only sprinkle or irrigate lawns within the City:
 - i. Before 9 a.m. and after 9 p.m.
 - ii. At the discretion of the City Council, upon notice or publication, an odd/even watering restriction may be established.
 - iii. Exceptions: The restrictions established in paragraphs i. and ii., above, do not apply to the use of water:
 - a) From a hose that person holds by hand
 - b) For recently established lawns. Those lawns may be watered daily for up to one month after installation, but only during the hours listed.
 - c) From a source of water other than the City's water system
 - iv. If an individual claims the privilege of an exception, the City may inspect the person's property during reasonable times to ensure compliance with this provision.
- C. Unless otherwise provided, violation of this ordinance is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1000.00 or imprisonment for up to 90 days.

Under 602(c)(1)(A) or 603(c)(1)(A), a general infrastructure project typically would not be considered a response to the public health emergency and its negative economic impacts unless the project responds to a specific pandemic-related public health need (e.g., investments in facilities for the delivery of vaccines) or a specific negative economic impact of the pandemic (e.g., affordable housing in a Qualified Census Tract).
- 4.6. How do I know if a specific use is eligible? [5/27] Fiscal Recovery Funds must be used in one of the four eligible use categories specified in the American Rescue Plan Act and implemented in the Interim Final Rule: a) To respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality; b) To respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers; c) For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency; and d) To make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure. Recipients should consult Section II of the Interim Final Rule for additional information on eligible uses. For recipients evaluating potential uses under (a), the Interim Final Rule contains a non-exclusive list of programs or services that may be funded as responding to COVID-19 or the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency, along with considerations for evaluating other potential uses of Fiscal Recovery Funds not explicitly listed. See Section II of the Interim Final Rule for additional discussion. For recipients evaluating potential uses under (c), the Interim Final Rule gives recipients broad latitude to use funds for the provision of government services to the extent of reduction in revenue. See FAQ #3.8 for additional discussion. For recipients evaluating potential uses under (b) and (d), see Sections 5 and 6.

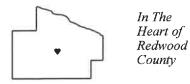

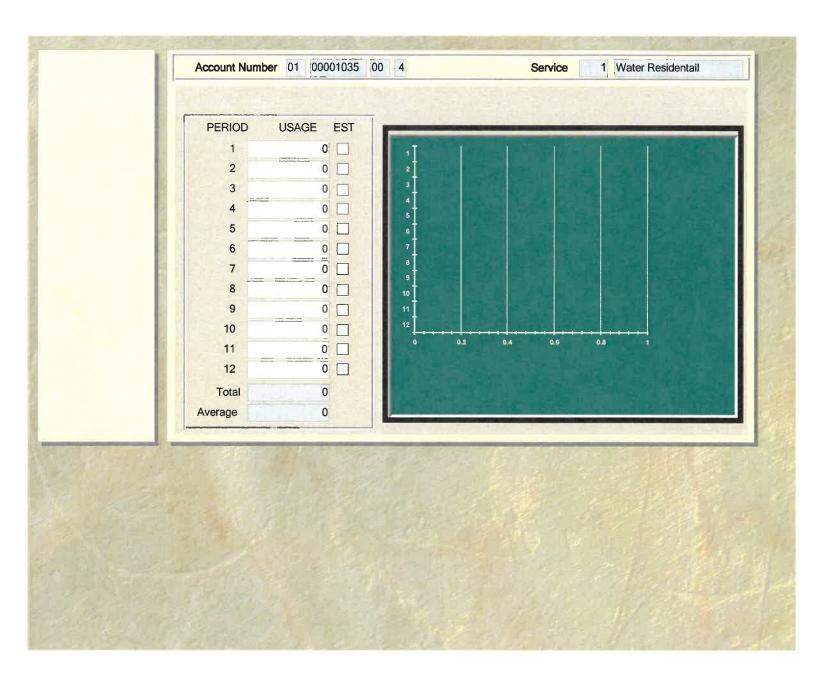

- Utility funds showed an increase in fund balance except sewer. It was noted the sewer fund
 was expected to decrease due to surveying work for the sewer rehab project, and 2021
 sewer rates were increased 10% in anticipation of the project)
- General government expenditures and revenues were over budgeted amounts mostly due to the COVID CARES grant, and Ambulance revenues were down due to write off of delinquent accounts.
- Three of the five deficiency items noted in the 2019 Audit Management letter were satisfactorily addressed. It was noted that the "due to" and "due from" items should be addressed in 2021

Ms. Towne noted the resolutions on the council agenda would address some of the items noted in the report and supported consolidating the city checking and savings accounts.

LRIP Project – Cedar St. City Engineer gave an overview of the project noting the history, grant award of \$1,250,000 and project cost of \$2,068,000. The project would include the complete rebuilding of the street, curb, gutter, sidewalk and storm sewer. It was noted that some of the sidewalk may be salvaged. It was anticipated that construction would take place in 2022 and be completed by 2023. Mr. Palm indicated that the project would need to be coordinated with the sewer rehabilitation project. Mr. Thompson indicated the gap between the grant and project cost would be funded by a combination of borrowing and assessments. The city would need to assess at least 20% of the amount borrowed to comply with the legal requirements. Mr. Palm estimated the funding gap would be approximately \$40/lf. Mr. Thompson added that discussion of a city assessment policy would be place on the next meeting agenda.

Sewer Rehabilitation – Mr. Palm gave an overview of the project and summary report. The plans had been revised to split the project into two categories – collection and treatment. The state required the split because it wanted to see how much the new collection system reduced I/I before approving the size of the treatment ponds. Mr. Palm noted the completed RD Apply application had been submitted to USDA staff. It appears the first phase of the project will be completed in 2023.

Roadhouse Street Dance – Diane Arends informed the council that the street dance on July 10th was a success and she was looking forward to having another street dance next summer. Ms. Arends indicated the promoter had asked if they could do another one this fall but she did not have the staff to serve the dance. Mr. Arends was looking for feedback from the council. It was the consensus of the Council that the dance was a large benefit for the community and looked forward to working with her for future events. Ms. Arends indicated that she did have a concern regarding people ignoring the barricades on Main St. and driving through the closed streets. The council gave some suggestions for adding signage, and that they would inform the Sheriff that the county should enforce the street closure restrictions. The council directed Mr. Thompson to post the restriction of the City website and

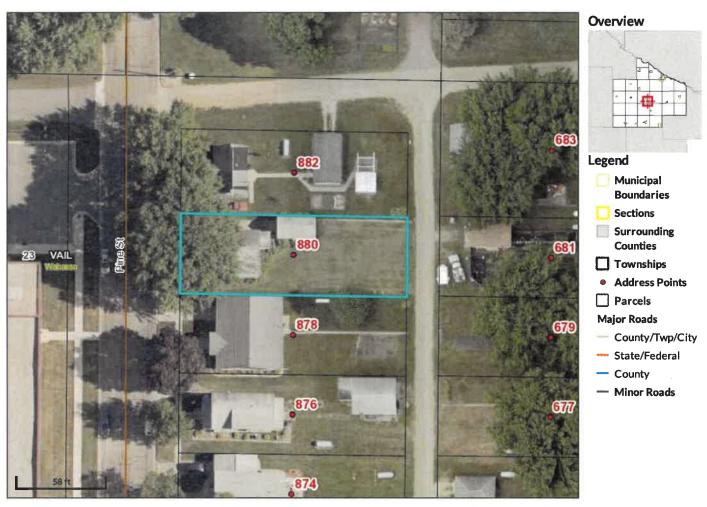
